

**Enhancements to FAASafety.gov
Effective September 30, 2011**

- Based on recent requests, we have greatly expanded the number of automated reports available to FAASafety Representatives. Here is what Reps will now see when they click on Reports under the Administration tab. The Validator List, Single User Report, and Area User Statistics will return results for your District only. The WINGS Phase Summary Report returns results for your Region and all Districts. All other reports will return results on a National basis. The statistics are for your use as a Representative, so be sure you understand the report before using them in meetings.


- WINGS**: Activity Participation Report, Previous WINGS Program Report, Validator List, WINGS Phase Summary Report

- In the "User Registration Report", the word "Active" means that the user has logged into his or her account at least once after registering on FAASafety.gov. Users who have created an account, but who have not yet logged in, are referred to as "New" because they are not yet Active.


- In the "Area User Statistics Report", you will see the phrase, "Total Airmen Records in the Registry." It is a big number based on records, not airmen. For example, I have a pilot certificate, a ground instructor certificate, and a flight instructor certificate. Therefore, even though I am one airman, I have three records in the Registry. The six entries at the bottom of the report with the word "New" actually refer to new users on FAASafety.gov.

- Since we have now developed the ability for Representatives to access the Single User Report, we have been working on giving Reps (and CFIs) the ability to revoke credits for User Activity Requests if they gave the airman credit. That can now be done by using the Single User Report by clicking on the red "x". This should only be done when it is clear you gave credit for the wrong Activity. Then, of course, you need to Give Credit for the correct Activity.

- Based on recent feedback, we have changed the name of the "CFI Portal" to "Instructor Portal" on the Home page. We have had several complaints that the "CFI Portal", by its very name, seemed to exclude non-CFIs who are instructors and who are authorized to use the tools in that portal. This should make it more inviting to all instructors – flight, ground, commercial balloonists, part 135 instructors, and part 142 instructors.
- We have had many inquiries about the word "Adjusted" in some reports. We clarified that by changing the word to "Revoked." It may appear to be a harsh word, but it is more descriptive! We also included a warning message when that option is selected, so you have a 2nd chance to consider that choice.
- You may be interested to learn that www.FAASafety.gov has been certified as Section 508 compliant. Section 508 requires that all Web site content be equally accessible to people with disabilities.
